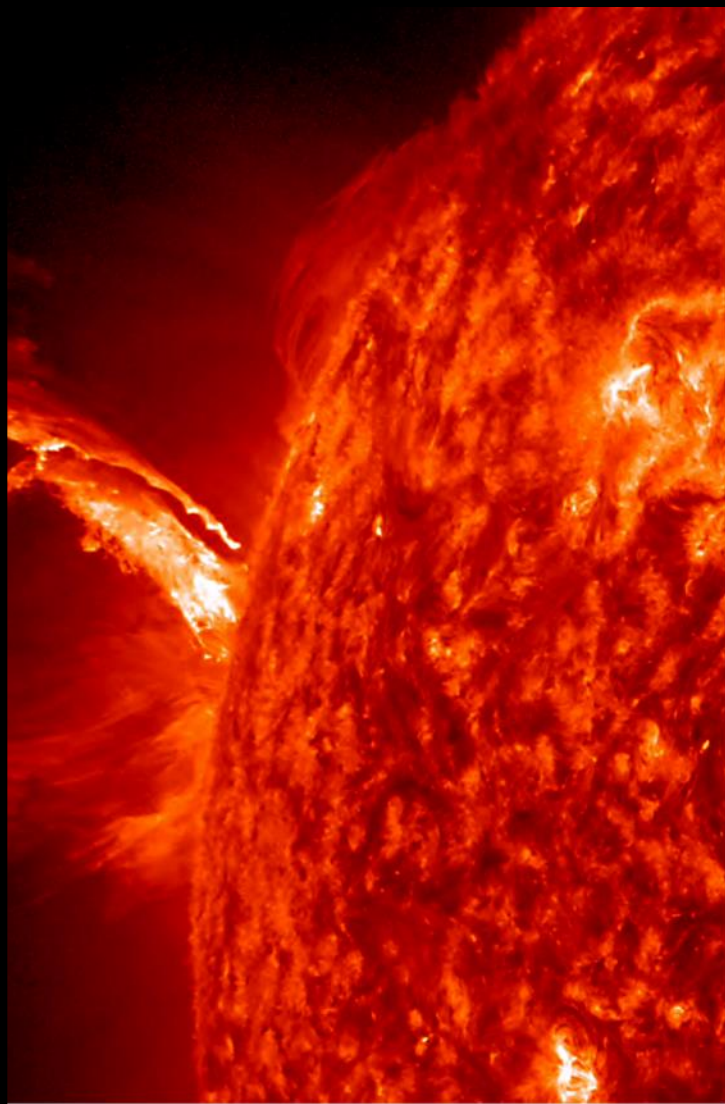

Allen County ARES Provides Support for Chain O Lakes Marathon



Allen County ARES provided support for the Ignite Trail Series Marathon / Half Marathon on Dec. 14th at Chain O Lakes State Park. This provides an opportunity for the team to practice communication skills and techniques that may be needed in the event they are needed by an organization during an emergency operation. This event is one of two events supported by ARES at the park.

Chain O Lakes provides a unique opportunity due to the extremely poor cell service within the park and the fact the operators are required to operate without commercial electrical power. This is an ideal opportunity for operators to test their equipment, operating procedures, and troubleshooting techniques that may be used for an emergency deployment.



They work closely with the event organizers to provide runner and aid station information. Runner progress and safety information as well as aid station needs

are provided to the organizers as needed. In the

event a runner is injured or requests to leave the course, ARES team rovers provide location and transportation services. They track the location of the first runners on the course and will follow the progress of the last runner to the end of the route to insure they complete the course safely.

Allen County ARES organized the operators for the event. Which included 17 operators from Allen, Noble, Whitley, and Kosciusko counties. Each operator was provided with an information package for the event that included a map of the course, that indicated the route and direction the runners will follow as well as locations of all aid stations and operator positions. With everything going on in the last 4 months or so it has been a tight schedule but I finally made the time to order our two new repeaters, two new power supplies to power the amplifiers. But because of the holiday our two new amplifiers will have to wait for ordering until Thursday. The last of the GE Mastr II Repeater equipment was scrapped after the Hamfest with no interested buyers at the Hamfest or someone at least willing to pay shipping (huge cost) or even willing to travel to pick it up. They served us well for 45 years but it was time. About \$100 in scrap was earned. But I did pull small parts that can be easily shipped and that would be of interest and I was correct as we have recently sold or about to sell those items. Solar Cycle Dates

On December 20, 2016, solar observers noted a small patch of magnetic field at 23 degrees south latitude on the solar disc and it was of the opposite polarity compared to Cycle 24 sunspots in the same southern solar hemisphere at lower solar latitudes. These characteristics (higher latitude and opposite polarity in the same hemisphere) suggested that it was the first sunspot of Cycle 25. Soon it did show a sunspot (a dark area) and it was assigned an Active Region number (12620).

Is December 20, 2016 when Cycle 25 started? Not really – it's just when the first sunspot of Cycle 25 emerged. The process that generated sunspots for Cycle 25 started around solar maximum of Cycle 24 (2012-2014), when the Sun's magnetic field reversed. Dr. Scott McIntosh, in his Zoom presentation to the FrontRange6Meter group on November 21, 2024 noted that the process for Cycle 26 has likely started since we're at solar maximum for Cycle 25.

These two dates (when the solar cycle process starts and when the first sunspot of the new cycle emerges) are important when talking about a solar cycle. A third important date is solar minimum. This has historically been defined as the month and year when the smoothed sunspot number numerically minimizes (reminder – solar cycles are officially measured by the smoothed sunspot number). Solar minimum between Cycles 24 and 25 occurred in December 2019.

A fourth important date is emerging – the terminator date from Dr. McIntosh, when the inferred solar magnetic field bands have moved from higher solar latitudes to the solar equator. Figure 1 shows these four dates for Cycle 25 (including my wild guess for the Cycle 25 terminator date).

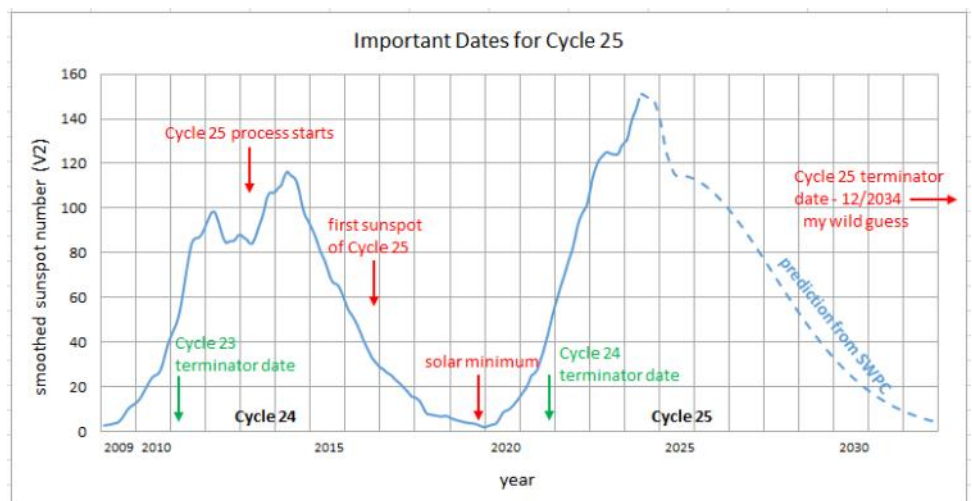
It's too early to tell when the true Cycle 25 terminator date will be. When it is identified, a

prediction for the magnitude of Cycle 26 will be available from the McIntosh team based on the time between the terminator date for Cycle 25 and the terminator date for Cycle 24 (which was December 2021 as indicated on Figure 1). Will the prediction be more accurate than the many other predictions for Cycle 26 that are likely to be published? We'll have to wait and see.

After the December 20, 2016 sunspot of Cycle 25, there were several more small patches of higher latitude magnetic fields that were of opposite polarity compared to Cycle 24 sunspots in the same hemisphere. But these small patches (Apr 8, 2018, Nov 17, 2018 and Jul 1, 2019) didn't result in sunspots and weren't assigned an Active Region number – thus they were not counted.

If my wild guess for the terminator date for Cycle 25 in Figure 1 comes true, the McIntosh method would say that Cycle 26 will be a small cycle. Note that the last two terminator dates occurred about 2 years past solar minimum – that's because old cycle sunspots still emerged after solar minimum.

Regardless of all this solar cycle information, right now the higher HF bands (15m, 12m and 10m – and even 6m to a lesser extent) are providing us with many worldwide opportunities on CW, SSB and FT8 with modest power and modest antennas. Get on the air and join the fun!

SKCC K3Y January Event

For the past 18 years, the Straight Key Century Club has designated January as their *special* celebration month. Members all over the world sign up to operate as a K3Y station. Last year there were more than 250 different K3Y stations and there were over 50,000 qso's made by those stations! This year's event begins at 0000utc on January 2nd. For us, here in Fort Wayne, it will begin Wednesday (January1) night at 7pm local time. Each K3Y station will have a *portable* designator such as K3Y/1, K3Y/9, K3Y/AS, K3Y/EU etc depending on their call area. Local operators will operate as K3Y/9. The K3Y stations will give a true signal report, their location, name, home call, and SKCC number. If you make contact with a K3Y station, send a true signal report, your state, your name, and your SKCC number or "NONE" if you don't have a number. This is an all mechanical key event so keyers and computer generated cw are not used. The special K3Y link/page on the SKCC website is loaded with K3Y info and will tell you who is operating along with keeping track of your contacts . . . yes, once you contact a K3Y station and he submits his log, that contact will appear on the K3Y log search and individual stats. This is always a fun event and, if you want to learn more and participate with fellow FWRC members.

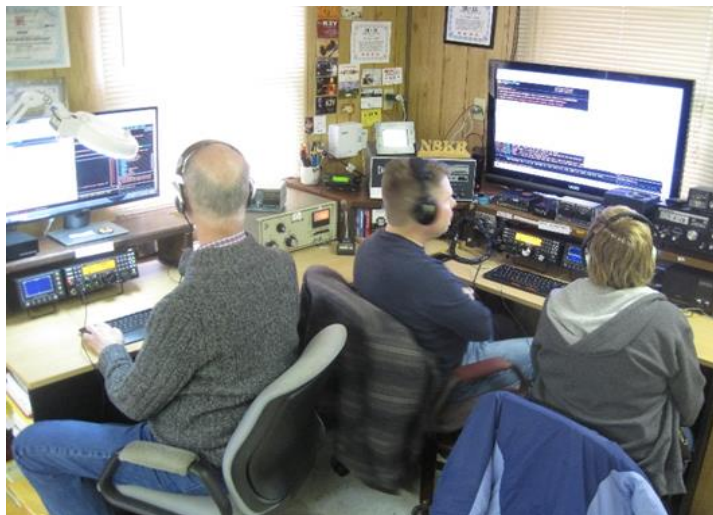

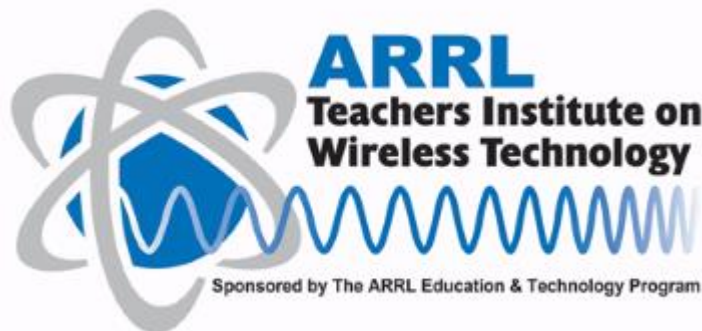
